<b>Other information</b>	Course resources and teaching methods are varied in order to be				

<b>related to the course</b>	inclusive. The tutor will introduce each technique through demonstrations, individual and group tuition. Regular feedback is given to all learners and progress is recorded using an Individual Learning Plan.
<b>What do I need to bring?</b>	New learners or those with little experience instructions will be given about the suitability of materials and what to bring for each session. A sharp pair of scissors and/or secateurs and plastic covering for the table will be useful together with a notebook and pen.
<b>Where next?</b>	During your course, your tutor will discuss appropriate progression opportunities available to you.
