As the course progresses you will be expected to keep a folder (portfolio) of the completed assessment tasks, with support, evaluation and feedback from your tutor. In order to				

	gain an ABC Award, you are required to submit your portfolio towards the end of the course. Regular feedback is given to all learners and progress is recorded using an Individual Learning Plan.
